






Nomination of new board members

Chair's Report



Strategic Plan implementation

- 2-year Extension of Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) Eskasoni Hydrology Project
- Donation from Bras d'Or Preservation Trust
- Inclusion of the Mi'kmaw Language into website and social media products
- Participation in the Atlantic Canada Tourism Corridor (to link the Atlantic Biospheres and UNESCO Heritage Sites through a tourism strategy).

Qualifying UNESCO buffer zones as OECMs within the Bras d'Or Lake Biosphere Region of Nova Scotia

The project has 4 main parts:

- 1.Governance/Management
- 2. Research (hydrological monitoring)
- 3. Documentation and prioritization
- 4. Knowledge Transfer



1.Governance/Management

Regularly scheduled meetings with a wide range of stake and rights holders

Inclusion of the Mi'kmaw language

Digital marketing and communications plans continues to be asset and utilized regularly

2. Research (hydrological monitoring)

Reid Dauphinee was awarded his masters degree with results showing that the wetlands and the area surrounding the wells are of highest conservation priority for groundwater recharge and streamflow generation

The team has submitted a paper for publication (Hydrological Processes)



3. Documentation and prioritization

A series of maps were developed to illustrate land ownership (public and private) in the Biosphere and help in identifying priority areas.

Key indicators identified by First Nations include cultural significance, threats due to climate change, habitat degradation and invasive species.

4. Knowledge Transfer

CBRA have created a wide variety of material, new membership fees implemented

CBRA National Gathering (September 16 – 19, 2024) was Biodiversity Blueprint: Achieving Biodiversity Targets through Biosphere Regions

- Biosphere Mapping GIS courses and support from partners
- ORB Organizations Representing the Bras d'Or
- Support IPCA and Dalhousie research
- Work with committees intern to also support
- Atlantic Gathering to return to Bras d'Or in spring 2026
- Funding applications Federal and provincial applications submitted, looking into municipal funding this fiscal
