Message from the Executive Committee

This past year has been very busy for the Bras d'Or Lake Biosphere Region Association (BLBRA). This work would not be possible without the hard work and commitment of committee members. volunteers, staff and the Board itself.

It is always amazing to see the passion that people have for the Bras d'Or Lake and the Biosphere. The purpose of this impact report is to highlight the accomplishments through the lens of the 2022-2025 BLBRA Strategic plan.

Many of the accomplishments of the year will be highlighted throughout, but three principal areas of achievement in 2023 -2024 that should be noted here include:

1. The signing of an amendment to the contribution agreement with Environment and Climate Change Canada, (March 2024) as part of the Department's involvement with 19 Biosphere regions across Canada. This provides a two-year extension of the project and an additional \$231,570 in funding for each year to March 2026. A separate summary of this project is available.

- 2. Inclusion of the Mi'kmaq Language into website and social media products when possible.
- 3. Participation of Biosphere staff and Board members in the Atlantic Canada Tourism Corridor which hopes to link the Atlantic Biospheres and UNESCO Heritage Sites through a tourism strategy.

Along with these accomplishments, there have been some challenges including the downgrading and rescheduling of the June Annual General Meeting. The Board has taken steps to rectify this and are confident the issue is now addressed.

Workplans for 2024-2025 are being developed with Bras d'Or Watch, Explore the Bras d'Or and the ECCC project being the immediate focus with plans to audit and inspect the BLBRA signage around the Biosphere happening later this summer.

Finally, much appreciation to all the Directors, Committee Chairs and members, volunteers and staff for their amazing work in the Biosphere.




BLBRA Strategic Plan

The 2022-2025 BLBRA Strategic Plan guides the organization as it works to improve balance in the Bras d'Or Lake Biosphere by encouraging community capacity building, conservation efforts, and sustainable development. It also serves as an orientation document for current and future board members. This strategic plan, facilitated by Acadia Entrepreneurship Centre, considered lessons learned from the BLBRA's first 10 years and helps chart a path for the next 10 years so that the Bras d'Or Lake will remain a UNESCO designated Biosphere after the 2031 periodic review.

Engagement

The Community Engagement and **Learning Committee members** have been successful in developing relationships with schools within the Biosphere. The committee has worked with Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey (MK) to share kits within the Mi'kmaw schools as well as provide kits to NS Education schools. Funding was secured to provide these kits to a number of schools. BLBRA staff have assisted with building the kits for delivery to the school. Teach the teacher events have taken place.

BLBRA has organized or participated in events that have taken place to engage in citizen science activities. For example, the presentation of teaching kits prior to the June 2023 AGM, the BLBRA Bras d'Or Expo and Bras d'Or Watch activities in promoting and expanding on the teaching kits, helping to facilitate Bras d'Or Watch.

The committee has also worked on signage to increase knowledge of tree species on the Nicholson Trail and will continue this work.

The Trails Committee has organized citizen science activities on trails during Explore the Bras d'Or as well as other opportunities throughout the year.

The "Muiwatmnej Etuaptmumk/Honouring Two-Eyed Seeing" conference in Membertou, NS, was a resounding success. Fostering a deepened understanding and appreciation of the Two-Eyed Seeing approach, the conference celebrated the application of this unique worldview across diverse disciplines and organizational relationships, helping attendees see how they can embrace Two-Eyed Seeing in their work. More than half the BLBRA Board attended the conference and the BLBRA sponsored two tickets for students. There was a table set up at the conference to provide information on the Biosphere where we sold 50 maps.







The BLBRA received the 2023 Golden Award for **Business** & **Industry**n recognition of the BLBRA's collaborative work within the Biosphere and in celebration of our redesignation/ recertification after the periodic review.

Atlantic Regional Biosphere Gathering

The 2023 Fall Atlantic Regional Biosphere meeting took place in November during CEPI's Two-Eyed Seeing conference. On November 13, 2023, the BLBRA hosted a meeting in ACAP's boardroom where discussions took place of sharing, planning & collaboration. In attendance there were 5 members from the BLBRA and 5 members from Southwest Nova and Funday combined. From November 14 - 15 the group enjoyed the Two-Eyed Seeing conference events held in Membertou First Nation and around Sydney. We got to hear from leaders such as Dr. Albert Marshall, Dr. Shelley Denny, David Suzuki and more on their Two-Eyed Seeing perspectives and how to incorporate it into our daily lives. In the evening the group enjoyed a dinner together at the Freight Shed in Baddeck. November 16 was the last day of the Atlantic Regional Biosphere gathering where Biosphere members enjoyed a hike on the Sky River Trail in We'ko'mag First Nation. The regional gathering ended with conference debriefing and discussions and the Funday Biosphere will be hosting the 2024 Atlantic Regional Biosphere gathering.

Adventure Lab App - Visited and assessed 4 sites for suitability to create Geocaching Adventure lab

Biosphere Launch - Participated at the Biosphere Launch in St Peter's to promote awareness and participation in the various activities.

Teaching Kits - A grant from TD Friends of the Environment Fund received in October allowed for the creation of 5 sets of kits that were distributed to Mi'kmaw Kina'matnewey schools. Workshops - A workshop was held at the Bell Historic Site ahead of the AGM in June 2023. Fifteen participants were able to learn about the contents of the teaching kits and how to use them.




BLBRA is working with Dalhousie University and Eskasoni Fish and Wildlife Commission (EFWC) and Fred Baechler to study groundwater and surface water systems and climate change impacts in the Bras d'Or Lake Biosphere Region with funding from Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC). Our Dalhousie team is led by Dr. Lauren Somers and graduate students Reid Dauphinee and Julia





We are focusing on the Christmas Brook Watershed in Eskasoni First Nation where a fault aquifer provides municipal water supply. The goal of our research is to develop a hydrological understanding of the local groundwater system and figure out where the water in the aquifer, and in Christmas Brook, comes from and how it may be impacted by climate

change.


